Notice hereby is given that an election of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon will be held at the City Hall in the City of Nyssa, Oregon, on the 30th day of June 1941, between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 8 o'clock P. M., to submit to the legal voters of the City of Nyssa, the question of issuing bonds of the City of Nyssa in the amount of \$13,000.00 for the purpose of improving the Water Works and distributing system, including the laying of new mains between the present water stand and Main Street and along Main Street between First Street and the Grade School Grounds; and also for the purpose of drilling and equipping a new well and for increasing the capacity of Well No. 2 and constructing a pump house over same; to be payable from revenues from said water system, and, in the event of a deficiency in such revenues, from taxes.

The vote will be by ballot, upon which shall be the words "Bonds Yes" and "Bonds No," and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes" or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No" which indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the measure will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of 8 o'clock A. M. and remain open until the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. of the same day when the same shall be closed.
