Newspaper Policy Announced

Having purchased the Nyssa Gate City Journal, we feel that we should issue a statement of policy to subscribers, prospective advertisers and others with whom we expect to transact business because of the semi-public nature of the enterprise.

We expect to print all of the news that we feel we can ethically publish without unduly injuring innocent persons. We will not publish items about cases of ordinary drunkenness or minor traffic violations. We do intend to publish news about reckless driving and crimes of a more serious nature, divorce cases and marriages.

The new publishers of this paper will not accept for publication copy advertising any kind of intoxicating liquor, including whisky, wine and beer. Although we realize this policy will cut into our revenue we are adopting it because we think it will benefit the community. We feel that the residents of Nyssa, generally, will support us in this attitude.

Nyssa is a growing city in the fastest growing county in Oregon and we expect to do our part in helping to extend that growth. Residents of a progressive town will support their local newspaper because they realize that a good paper reflects credit on their community. An editor cannot publish a good paper if the residents of the community do not support his efforts.

We feel certain that we can depend on the residents of Nyssa to help us make a success of our new venture.

War Without a Slaymaker

No small part of the difference in the fervor between now and the months preceding the entry of the United States into the last world war can be laid to the absence of a successor to a man by the name of Slaymaker.

The name of Slaymaker is nearly forgotten, but his works remain vivid in the minds of even those who were children at the time of the last war. For it was Slaymaker who translated his own hatred of everything Imperial Germany into posters so powerful that they played a major part in inflaming the people of America, within a few months' time, into war against a nation that had been almost a friend.

It was Slaymaker who set the style for the caricatures of Kaiser Wilhelm that outlasted the war—cartoons so subtle in their ridicule and so powerful in their suggestion of innate evil in a man that hate of the Kaiser became a personal thing with both civilians and soldiers alike. And it was Slaymaker who drew those posters of German atrocities against French and Belgian women and children—posters that wrung the hearts of even the most peaceful into the desire to kill with their own hands.

In that time of nearly a quarter of a century ago, Slaymaker played his part, and under government sponsorship, with none disputing his right. Today's war has no Slaymaker, and it is better for the lack. And, by policy, our government of today does not encourage the rise of a successor.

For the people of the United States are wiser now, and are desirous of keeping cool heads in their conduct of international affairs.
