NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That sealed bids will be received by the Board of Directors of Union High School District No. 4, Malheur County, Oregon, by Florence Otis, Clerk of said District at Adrian, Oregon, until 8:00 o'clock p. m. on the 16th day of February, 1942, for the purchase of an issue of funding bonds of said Union High School District No. 4, Malheur County, Oregon, in the amount of \$17,455.00.

Said bonds will be negotiable coupon bonds; each will be designated "Funding Bond"; will be dated as of March 1, 1942, and will be in denominations of \$500.00 each, except the last thereof which will be in the sum of \$455.00; will be numbered consecutively from 1 to 35, both numbers inclusive; will mature serially in numerical order in the amount of \$2,500.00 on the 1st day of March in each of the years 1942 to 1948, both years inclusive, and in the amount of \$2,455.00 on the 1st day of March, 1949; will bear interest at a rate not to exceed four per cent (4%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of September and the 1st day of March of each year until maturity; will be payable both as to principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the County Treasurer of Malheur County, at Vale, Oregon; and will be callable after March 1, 1943.
