"AN OVEN MEAL WITHOUT POINTS"

An oven dinner without points! If I had written that a year ago you would have wondered what I was talking about or if I had said a can of corn costs 14 points you would have wondered at the clarity of the sentence. But now this has become everybody's byword and we try to shop in order to get the most for our points as well as the most for our money.

Oven dinners are time and money savers and when mother is taking home nursing or first aid and daughter is knitting and sewing for Red Cross, oven dinners, which are quick and easy—are the answer to the busy housewives prayer.

Here's one which doesn't take any points and which is full of vitamins, minerals and everything that makes up a well rounded meal.

Stuffed Meat Loaf, Steamed Carrots, Apple Sauce, Graham Bread and Gingerbread.

STUFFED MEAT LOAF

1 pound ground beef

3 T. finely chopped green pepper

4 T. finely chopped onion

1/2 T. salt

1/2 T. Worcestershire sauce

1/2 T. sage, if desired

1/2 cup soft bread crumbs

1/2 cup water, tomato juice, or soup

1 egg

Stuffing

Combine all ingredients. Mix well. Make a layer of one-half the meat mixture in a loaf pan. Cover with stuffing, press remaining meat mixture over the stuffing. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for 1 hour. Serves 6 or 8.

STUFFING

2 T. butter or meat drippings

1 cup soft bread crumbs

1/2 cup water or soup stock

2 T. chopped onion

2 T. chopped celery

Salt and pepper

Melt fat. Combine all ingredients. Mix well.

GRAHAM BREAD

1/2 cup sugar

3 cups graham flour

1/2 cup baking molasses

1 T. soda

1-1/2 teaspoon salt

1 cup sour milk or buttermilk

1 egg

1 T. melted butter

Beat egg, add sour milk, and melted butter and molasses. Mix the graham flour, soda, salt and sugar together and add to first mixture, beating only enough so mixture is well blended. Pour into a well greased loaf pan. Bake 1 hour with oven dinner.
