In Umatilla county alone there are 38,000 acres of canning peas, with a value of \$6,400,000; about 22,000 acres of prunes valued at \$2,000,000; 21,000 acres of dried peas, estimated at \$2,100,000.

The 130 conscientious objectors at Wicklup, on the Deschutes project, will be continued there until further orders. These conscripts are working on the reservoir site, clearing the area of trees. Announcement is made that these objectors will be maintained on the project at the authorized strength. They are working for the bureau of reclamation and are carrying on the work formerly performed by CCC boys until that organization was liquidated.

Myrthus Evans will be the new superintendent at the Indian school at Chemawa. Mr. Evans has been principal of the high school for Navajo Indians in the southwest, reports the bureau of Indian affairs. Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the interior department, came to Washington when President Roosevelt was preparing to throw out the Republican appointees of President Hoover and wanted the job as Indian commissioner.

FARM WIRING Farmers who are eligible for a new electrical connection now may obtain up to 75 pounds of copper wire for on-farm wiring on certification by the county USDA War Board.

SEED TO ALLIES One reason that Oregon growers of vegetables and forage crop seeds are asked to increase production is seen in the report by the office of war information on lendlease shipments during February.

FARM TRACTOR GAS County farmers who need gas for farm tractors and other non-highway uses will apply to the OPA Rationing Board. If the applicant and Rationing Board can't agree on the amount of gas needed, the application will be handled solely by the Rationing Board.

MAY 1, AAA SIGN-UP DEADLINE American civilians will have a little less food this year than they did in 1942, but more than they ate in other recent years, reports to the office of war information.

In order to be eligible for support prices on potatoes, beans, peas and other essential war crops each Malheur County farmer must be signed up in the 1943 conservation program. Eligibility for possible incentive payments and loans will also depend on the farmer being signed in the 1943 program, according to Pieter Tensen, chairman of the Malheur county war board.

FOOD FRONT BRIEFS The estimated 9,308,000 persons employed on American farms April 1, represents a 7 per cent decrease in hired workers, but about the same number of family workers as a year ago. Sugar will be available for home canning on about the same basis as last year.
