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## Nysa Milk To Be Pasteurized

Roscoe Kellogg of the Gate City dairy, working with the state department of agriculture, the city council and the city health officer, announced this week that starting the first of next week he will be in a position to furnish pasteurized milk to the city of Nyssa.

Mr. Kellogg and the various departments have been studying the milk problem and feel that pasteurized milk will be a big asset to the city. Lorel Anderson, state inspector, said. Many of the larger cities have realized the advantages of pasteurized milk and have passed laws prohibiting the sale of raw milk.

Modern equipment has been installed by Mr. Kellogg, who has been instructed in the pasteurizing of milk by the state department of agriculture representative.

Despite the difficulties faced by the dairymen today, Mr. Kellogg intends to maintain a safe and healthful milk supply for Nyssa, he said.

"It is a grand improvement for the city to have pasteurized milk," Dr. L. A. Maulding, city health physician, said. Pasteurized milk protects babies and children against transmissible diseases, such as typhoid fever, undulant fever, scarlet fever, tuberculosis and septic sore throat. It is something we have needed for a long time."

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
