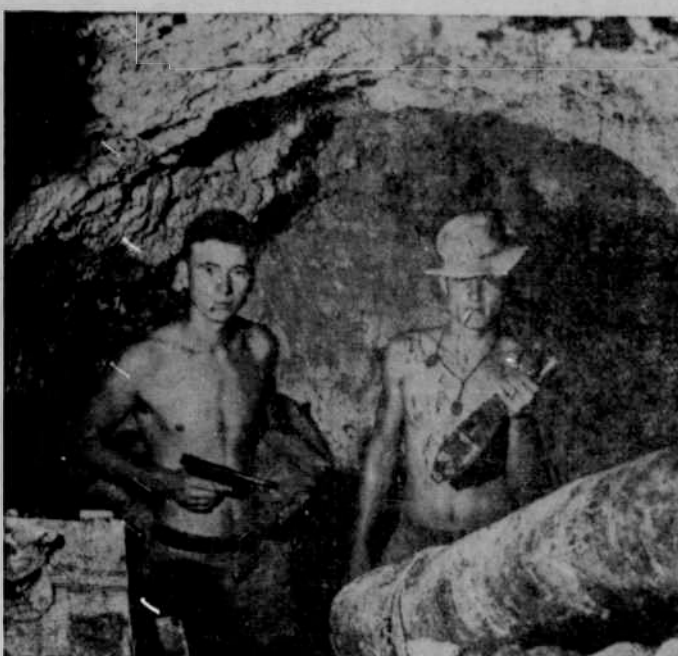

FOUR TREES FOR A CENT
The state forestry department has 1,500,000 forest tree seedlings for planting between now and next March. They are available to the public at one-fourth of a cent each. A minimum of 200 must be taken at a time. They are valuable for woodland planting, as a shelter belt or breakwater.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL RULES
Marriage by proxy is not permissible under the laws of Oregon, states Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle in clarifying a case where one of the persons interested is in the war service overseas. The supreme court has held that a marriage cannot be performed in Oregon unless both contracting parties are present before the minister or officer conducting the ceremony.

FEWER FOREST FIRES
There were 632 forest fires during the first ten months of this year.

Of the twelve million acres of lands under the protection of the state department of forestry only 5200 acres were burned. This is the fifth consecutive year fires losses have been held under the ten thousand acre mark.

Lightning started 256 fires or 40 percent of the total. This is three times as many as have ever been recorded in one year. Smokers started 133 fires, incendiary 158, campers 24, brush fires without permits 27 and logging 32.

PRE-WAR FATHERS
Only a few pre-war fathers will be drafted in Oregon in December, the number being about the same as in October, Col. Elmer V. Wood, state selective service director announces. The number remains small because of the small size of Oregon's draft quotas, he said.

CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTORS
The federal government has made a proposal to the state to employ conscientious objectors in state institutions to relieve shortage of help.

After hearing the plea of Dr. J. M. Odell, superintendent of the eastern Oregon state tuberculosis hospital at The Dalles, the state board of control has taken the proposal under consideration. Dr. Odell said the employment situation at his institution was critical and immediate action was necessary if the hospital is to remain open and is operated at anywhere near capacity.

The board has received similar reports from heads of other institutions. The shortage of janitors and maids is particularly acute.

The Oregon post war readjustment and development commission and the League of Oregon Cities have sponsored a series of post war conferences. The first to be held at The Dalles on November 15.
