SOLDIERS VOTE FIRST

"Were William Allen White alive today he might be writing a book titled, 'What's the Matter With Congress?' After months of political jockeying congress passed the soldiers so-called ballot act, which for screwball perfection is a runner-up for the income tax bill muddle. This act would require the voter to write in the name of the candidate of his choice but only for president and the congress. The ballot would have no printed list of candidates. A soldier outside the United States who had not received political news from home would have to rely on his memory of what was being politically when he left. Under such conditions it would not be surprising if the late U. S. Senator Charles L. McNary should get a majority of this vote.

Governor Earl Snell is determined that voters outside the United States will be able to cast their vote at the coming elections and that they will have the names of all candidates before them on a regularly printed ballot, just as it would be if they were voting in their home precinct.

The governor vows this plan will be carried out even if its accomplishment means calling a special session of the legislature.

OREGON LAW MAZE

Oregon is far behind other states in revising its laws, says Kenneth J. O'Connell, associate professor of law at the University of Oregon.

"Oregon laws are now an unsystematic accumulation of statute upon statute from the earliest enactment until the present," says O'Connell and points out that litigation springs from the ambiguities and confusions of the present form. He suggests the appointment of a reviser of statutes on full time.

BRICKNER COMING

Governor John W. Brickner of Ohio will come into Oregon April 13 on a scouting tour to appraise his chances of getting support from delegates to the Republican national convention. Brickner's name will not appear on the Oregon primary ballot but he considers his chances good should a deadlock occur at the convention.

FEWER DEFERMENTS

State Selective Service Director Elmer V. Wootton has instructed Oregon's 57 local draft boards to call for pre-induction physical examinations all registrants under 26 years of age who are currently in class 2-A or 2-B, provided they have not been physically examined within the past 90 days. This procedure complies with instructions from national headquarters. Local boards will review younger men first. Only those classed as extremely necessary for war work or industries will be deferred. The new order will affect less than 5000 men in

Oregon, more than 50 percent of them in the lumber industry, second largest group in transportation and third those in the shipyards.

STATE PAYS KEEP

Parents of boys and girls in the state training schools no longer will have to pay the state for taking care of their children. Attorney General Neuner ruled the state board of control has no authority to collect such payments. Only a few parents have been making payments. A 1943 law providing for payments for care of children in institutions applies only to privately-owned state-aided institutions and not to state-owned institutions, Neuner ruled.

CAPITAL SHORTS

Easter sunrise services will be conducted in the sunken gardens on the capitol grounds. State Senator Frederick S. Lamport, of Salem, has been named by Governor Earl Snell as treasurer of voluntarily donated funds to provide a portrait of the late U. S. Senator Charles L. McNary. The painting will hang in the senate chambers in Washington, D. C. State police recovered stolen motor vehicles valued at \$28,000 the past month. Stores selling Easter lilies and other potted plants must obtain a license from the state department of agriculture. Employers operating under the workmen's compensation act will receive rate reductions on July 1 amounting to approximately 10 percent. McDonnell Brown has been appointed OPA director for the Portland district comprising 35 counties in Oregon and 5 in Washington. He succeeds Richard G. Montgomery who resigned to become a partner in the W. S. Kirkpatrick advertising and public relations service in Portland.
