(Who's Crazy Now?)  
"---wherefore then were ye not afraid to speak against my servant Moses." Num 12:8

Many and vicious have been the accusations of the wicked against the righteous; but always God honors the righteous and confuses the wicked. Miriam and Aaron lifted their voices against Moses. God said: "With him I speak mouth to mouth--and the similitude of the LORD shall he behold." Miriam became leprous and Aaron's sons dishonored his name. David was called "the man after God's own heart" but Michal was barren to the day of her death. This election is called for the purpose of electing one director for a term of five years.

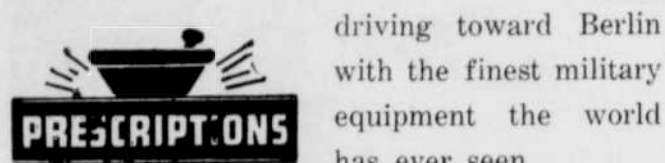
