FOOD FARM WAR NEWS

DAIRY PRODUCER HAS BEST RATIO
Livestock-feed price ratios during June continued more favorable for dairy production than for other livestock enterprises, the USDA reports. Present indications are that total milk production on farms for 1944 probably will be as great, and may exceed, the 188-billion pounds produced in 1943. Dairy pasture conditions nationally on June 1 were the most favorable for June in the past 22 years. Milk production per cow on June 1 was 1 percent lower than a year ago and the percentage of cows milked was lower than any June 1 reported except 1925 and 1934, but there are a greater number of milk cows on farms.

Austrian winter peas, 5 cents per pound; hairy vetch, 11c; common vetch (Willamette vetch), 6c; crimson clover, 11½c; common ryegrass, 7c. Detailed specifications as to discounts for below top quality seed can be secured from your county triple A office. Purple and Hungarian vetch will qualify as common vetch, provided there is at least 80% common vetch present. Hairy vetch shall not be discounted due to the presence of wollypod, rough peavine or perennial peavine.
CARLOAD SEED PURCHASE PROGRAM
The war food administration announces that the Commodity Credit corporation shall make purchases under the 1944 seed purchase program in carload lots. This provision is intended to simplify the handling of seeds for government purchase and still insure the grower the minimum basic prices. The principle differences between the procedure for purchasing seed from producers and buying seed in carload lots from dealers are that no memorandum of understanding is required to be executed by the dealers, storage and handling of seeds will be paid by the dealers, and included in the price paid the dealers is an amount equal to the handling charge set up for handling seed purchased from producers. Each dealer's memorandum of purchase will cover a carload of seed. Purchases from dealers will be only on the basis of official germination and purity reports. Uniformity of seed quality is insured by the handling charge.
