ERROR DISCREDITS STATE

State Industrial Accident Commissioner T. Morris Dunne terms as "untrue" a statement accredited by a Portland newspaper to Ronald P. Blake, Washington D.C., senior safety engineer for the U. S. department of labor, that Oregon had 60,000 lost time logging accidents in 1943. Commissioner Dunne said that Oregon actually had only 4300 such accidents last year. There were only 56,000 lost time accident in all industries in the state last year. This is a very low figure considering the 50,000 wartime workers in the shipyards. At the direction of Governor Earl Snell the efforts of the commission have been centered on accident prevention the past two years, with a policy of prevention rather than compensation.

It seems that we are always finding new things and not the least important is a brand new way to mix cakes. Creaming the shortening and sugar has always been one of the "must-does" in a cream cake and one of the things not so enjoyable about baking-with this new method this is eliminated.

In fact-the amazing part of this cake is that it upsets just about every rule and principal that we have been taught regarding cake home.

HURRY-UP CAKE

- 2 c sifted cake flour
1 1/4 c sugar
3/4 tsp baking powder
1 tsp salt
1/2 c shortening (Spry or Crisco)
1 c milk
1 tsp vanilla
1/2 tsp lemon extract
3 egg whites unbeaten
Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt into mixing bowl. Add shortening. Add 2-3 cup of the milk and the flavoring. Beat until perfectly smooth (about 100 strokes) or if using an electric mixer, beat on Medium for 2 minutes. Add egg whites and remaining milk and beat until well blended, or 2 minutes on Medium in an electric mixer. Pour into 2 greased and floured 6" pans. Bake 30 minutes at 350 degrees. For Cupcakes, fill pan 1/2 full. Bake 18 minutes at 350 degrees.
