## NOTICE OF ESTABLISHING SPECIAL WEED CONTROL DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That under and by virtue of Chapter 5, Title 35 of Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated the County Court of the State of Oregon for Malheur County did on the 5th day of December, 1945, by resolution duly and regularly passed and adopted, create and establish a Weed Control District within said County and State, the boundaries of which are more particularly described as follows:

Starting at a point at the intersection of Twp 20 S, R 47 E, and Oregon Idaho Boundary line, thence west along the north side of Section 30, Twp 20 S, R 47 E, Section 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, to the Northeast section corner of Sec. 29, Twp 20, R 46 E, to the west bank of the Owyhee River, thence in a southerly westerly direction along the west bank of the Owyhee River to its intersection of the west line of Section 23, Twp 21 S, R 45 E, thence south along the west line of Section 23, to the southwest section corner of Section 23, Twp 21, R 45 E, thence east along the south line of Sections 23 and 24, Twp 21, R 45 E and south line of Section 19, 20, 21, 22 Twp 21, R 46 E, to the Snake River, thence in a northeasterly direction along the Snake River to the Oregon Idaho boundary line, thence north along the Oregon Idaho boundary line to point of beginning.

That the purpose of said Weed Control District is to prevent the spreading and development of noxious weeds hereinafter described and to prevent and destroy the blooms, reseeding and reproduction of the following noxious weeds:

White Top (Lepidium draba) - Canada Thistle (Carduus arvensis) - Russian Knapweed (Centauria pteris) - Morning Glory (Convolvulus arvensis)

Blue Flowering Lettuce (Lactuca pulchella) And any other weeds which may be declared noxious during the time this district remains established.

This shall constitute official notice of the creation and establishment of said weed control district and is served upon any and all persons interested therein, by authority of the said County Court for said County and State by publication thereof in the Gate City Journal, a weekly newspaper of general circulation within said County and State, for a period of two successive weeks, and that immediately following the last publication of this official notice the provisions of this act shall be enforced in accordance with the purpose and intent of said act.
