George Hopkins, University of Oregon pianist, will present an all-Chopin concert in the Ontario high school gymnasium at 8:15 p. m. Wednesday, March 27.

The current "rage" over the music of the great Polish-French composer is especially timely because of the approaching centenary observance of Chopin's death. His music is so varied and covers such a wide emotional range it meets the demand of a complete concert program.

The famous "B Minor Sonata" to be featured on the program is

considered by musicians to be one of the greatest works ever written for the piano. Some of the more "popular" numbers will be recognized as favorites from the motion picture "Song To Remember."
