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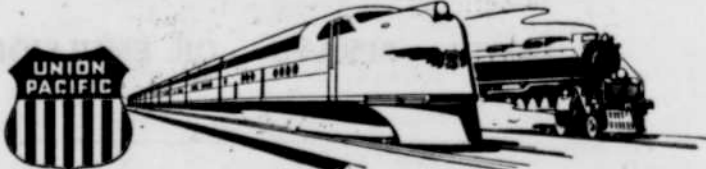

NEW ONTARIO BANK BUILDING PLANNED

Joe F. Dyer, manager of the Ontario branch of the United States National Bank of Portland, has announced that his institution has purchased four lots from Mr. and Mrs. Lee F. Cables south of the Ontario city hall for erection of a new bank building.

Architects will start preparing plans in the near future and construction will be started as soon as building materials are available and permission is granted by the C. P. A.

"A steady increase in business during the past several years has made it necessary to find larger quarters," Mr. Dyer said. "No information is available as to the type or size of the structure, but officials at the head office in Portland intimate that it will be of sufficient size to care for the anticipated increase of business for many years to come."

EXAMINATION FOR ACADEMY IS SET

Congressman Lowell Stockman will have two vacancies to the United States naval academy at Annapolis for the class beginning July 1, 1947.

Candidates for the naval academy must be not less than 17 years of age or more than 21 years of age on April 1 of the calendar year (1947) in which they enter the naval academy. Applicants should be high school seniors or graduates of high school, or college students. Boys in the armed services are eligible.

Exceptions to this age requirement are made only when a boy has had one year of acceptable service in any one of the armed forces. In such cases he can be admitted to the academy if he has not passed his 23rd birthday on the first

of April of the calendar year in which he would enter the naval academy. Such admission is, of course, contingent upon his meeting the mental and physical requirements.

The civil service commission expects to hold a competitive examination on July 24, 1946 to aid in the selection of nominations for the academy. Applicants must be residents of the second congressional district of Oregon, and able to meet the exacting physical standards of the academy.

Any boy who is interested and qualified may obtain additional information and permission to take the examination given on July 24 by writing at once to Congressman Lowell Stockman, house office building, Washington, D. C.

Home libraries may always be borrowed from the County library at Ontario and during the summer months they may be kept until September without change if desired.

Popular books on horses are "The Western Horse" by Gorman, "Wild Horse Of The West" by Wyman and C. W. Anderson's beautifully illustrated books on the thoroughbreds.

There will be children's books at all county library stations during the summer.
