Mr. and Mrs. F. J. Carpenter and family of Madras, Oregon arrived Friday for a few day's visit with friends.

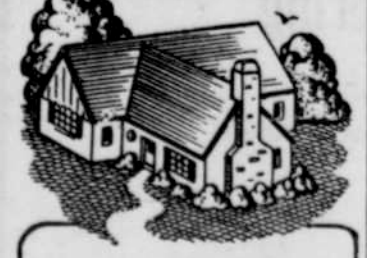
Go Fishing

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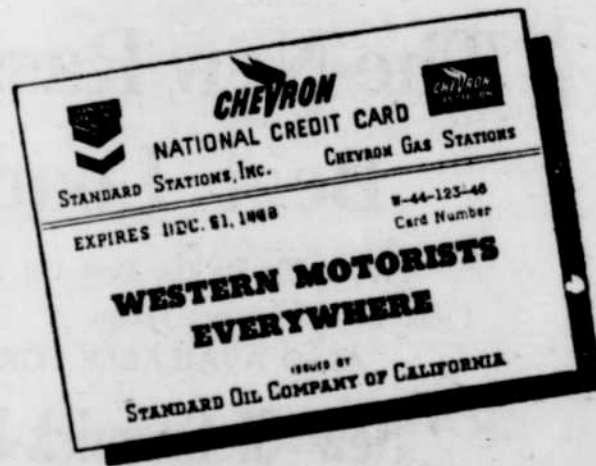

Notice of School Election

Upon question of increasing tax levy over amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 26-C of Malheur County, State of Oregon, at the elementary school in said district from 2:00 until 7:00 P. M. on July 17, 1946, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1946-47 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are increased salaries of personnel, maintenance and repair deferred during the war years and new construction.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6 per cent limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$24,539.38.
