17,000 PHEASANTS RAISED NEAR HERE

Between 17,000 and 18,000 pheasants will be released from the state pheasant farm southwest of Ontario this year, it was reported this week by Harold Sevey, superintendent.

Only a few of these pheasants will be released in Malheur county, as this farm serves virtually all of eastern Oregon. Most of the birds will go to Umatilla, Baker, Wallowa and Klamath counties.

The number of birds raised this year is about the same as last year. The feed problem has been serious, aside from the farm's own feed production.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BOUNDARY SETTLED

Settlement of the boundary between school districts 47 and 19 in the Big Bend area was made last week by the county court in session here with that part of district 47 on the south side of the Snake river being put in district 19. 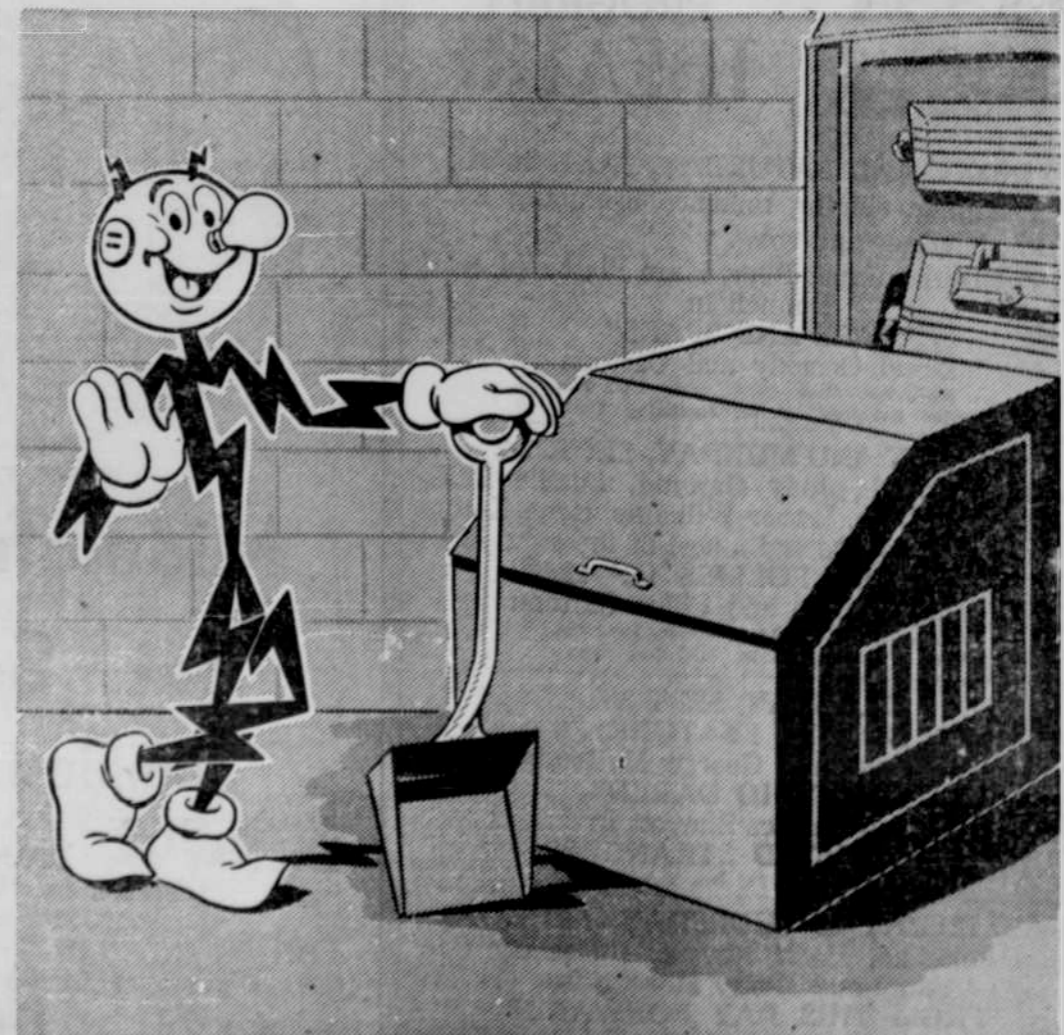
