ORDINARY MAIL TO BE SENT TO JAPAN
Post cards and ordinary unregistered and uninsured gift parcels will now be accepted for mailing to Japan. The service extends only to the islands of Honshu, Kyushu, Shikoku and Hokkaido.

Post card communications are restricted to messages of a personal or family nature written in English, Chinese, Japanese, French, Korean, Russian or Spanish, postal officials said.

Gift parcels must not exceed 11 pounds in weight, and only one parcel per week may be sent by or on behalf of the same sender.

ical termination of the war which may come at any time.

Specifically this means that those who enlist after October 5 will be granted these rights only in proportion to the time they have served before the official termination.

For example, if a man enlisted October 6 and hostilities were to be officially terminated November 6, he would receive only one month's government paid education in the college, trade or business school of his choice for every month served, up to 48 months, equivalent to over five ordinary school years.

Not only will the government pay for his college courses, Col. Cahoon concluded, but, in all probability, the present overcrowded conditions in colleges will be eased by that time, assuring the student of greater individual attention under vastly pleasanter conditions than now exist.

CORRECT BUTTER LABELS REQUIRED

Labeling of butter must be brought in line with the actual butter quality, officials of the state department of agriculture said in asserting that insistence will be placed upon the correct and proper labeling of this commodity.

Kenneth E. Carl, assistant chief of the division of foods and dairies in charge of dairy enforcement, pointed out that 50 per cent of a quantity of butter picked up in Portland stores was mislabeled as to grade.

"We failed to find a single pound of butter labeled as grade B butter in the stores where purchases were made. But when the samples were analyzed, just about half of that butter marked or labeled as grade A butter was actually grade B butter," Carl said.

This condition is not confined to Portland and as rapidly as possible the department is moving to correct the situation, which is a quality defect brought about largely by wartime conditions. Greatest emphasis in correction will be placed before the creamery operators and butter graders and makers because through a program of this type officials will be able to realize in quickest possible time their insistence upon proper labeling.

Officials point out that grade A, grade B and grade C butter—all properly labeled with the official Oregon butter grade emblem—are legal for sale in Oregon. The consumer is entitled to have the quality designated on each butter wrap-

per label and the department intends to watch the situation closely to see that there is no upgrading of butter, Carl said.

CLERKS ARE WANTED IN POST OFFICES

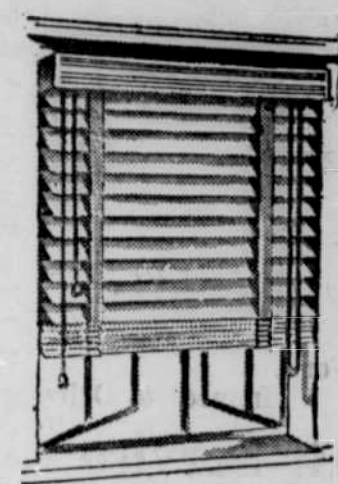
