SAN FRANCISCO, OCT. 10—To Ray A. Stull of Stockton, California fell the honor here of being the 100,000th man recruited by the sixth army, which has jurisdiction over the eight western states of Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah and Washington.

Stull, who enlisted for three years in the army air forces, was sworn in by Col. M. L. McCreary, recruiting officer of the sixth army area, while thousands of Legionnaires gathered in San Francisco gave their approval.

The impressive ceremony was a sober note for the Legionnaires who were gathered from all parts of the country for their national convention and typified their belief in the necessity for a strong national defense.

Stull's enlistment was sponsored by the Stockton post of the American Legion. He was selected as the 100,000th enlistee from a group of 125 men who were sworn in at the Legion convention. The entire group of 125 were American Legion sponsored and represented the finest young men in the country. Stull is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Stull of Stockton.
