SITTON NAMED TO REPRESENT ALUMNI

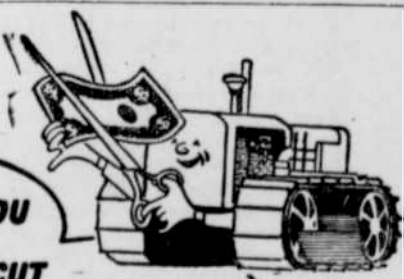
