RESOLUTION 135 A Resolution Declaring Intention to and Commencing Proceedings for Vacation of a Portion of Green Avenue.

WHEREAS, The following described portion of Green Avenue in the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, State of Oregon, at this time is not used or needed for purposes of public travel or conveniences, and the area thereof is valuable for purposes of the adjacent owners, and it is deemed in the interests of the City of Nyssa that such portion of Green Avenue be closed, to-wit:

All that portion of Green Avenue in Green Addition to the City of Nyssa, lying between the Westerly line of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Right of Way and a line 80 feet West of and parallel to said Westerly line, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE it Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Nyssa, Oregon, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Nyssa, Oregon by and through its Common Council hereby determine and declares the intention of such City and Council to commence and initiate a proceeding for the vacation of the following described portion of Green Avenue in the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon:

All that portion of Green Avenue in Green Addition to City of Nyssa lying between the Westerly line of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Right of Way and a line 80 feet West of and parallel to said Westerly line,

in the manner provided by Chapter 259, Oregon Laws 1931. Section 2. That Notice of Resolution and Proceedings for Vacation of that portion of Green Avenue in Green Addition, shall be given by publication of notice once each week for four consecutive and successive weeks, and for five publications, in the Nyssa Gate City Journal, a weekly newspaper printed and published at Nyssa, Oregon, and by posting of a copy of the notice at each end of such portion of Green Avenue proposed
