**GLADYS' DEFENSE CALLS NO WITNESS**

Doctor, which was terminated when he decided not to go through with the killing. The reason he later killed the doctor was self defense. He inflicted the fatal gunshot wound after he began to fear great bodily harm when the doctor charged him with a jack-knife.  
In perhaps the most sensational testimony in the trial, Williams testified earlier in the week that he killed Dr. Broadhurst because of a voice that he said rang through his brain—the voice of Gladys Broadhurst. He said he cried at the last minute not to kill the doctor as his fingers tightened around the wrench with which he was to strike the blow. Williams testified that he picked up the wrench on a lonely road leading to Dr. Broadhurst's Jordan valley ranch as the doctor stooped over the stalled engine of his automobile. He started to hit the doctor on the head, but decided not to do it. Then he said he heard Gladys' voice ringing through his mind "don't fail me, don't fail me".  
After delivering the crushing blow Williams said he did not want to kill. He gave Broadhurst a cloth to place over the hole in his skull and then the doctor "came at him with a pocketknife". Williams said he screamed "Don't, Doc, don't. He then picked up a shotgun and fired a load of buckshot into the doctor's chest.  
Williams testified that he had only carried out the instructions given him the night before by Gladys Broadhurst.  
Earlier in his testimony, Williams told of his illicit love affair with Mrs. Broadhurst and of a trip they took to California. They spent the first night in their car at Reno. He said she kissed him on the cheek because, she told him, he looked like a brother of hers. Then she kissed him again, he said, this time on the mouth.  
From there, he said, they went to an auto camp between Truckee and Lake Tahoe and spent four or five nights there, he going from his cabin to her tent, and returning early in the mornings to his cabin. He said this began when she told him she was afraid to sleep alone.  
After that they lived as man and wife in Sacramento and Bakersfield. He said she discussed the Ten Commandments with him, told him they had already committed adultery and it would be no worse to murder. He said she told him Broadhurst was "more an animal than a man".  
It was on this trip, Williams said, that he and Mrs. Broadhurst plotted the murder of the doctor.


