Marice H. Hoover of Boise, vice president of Pacific Trailways, was in Nyssa early this week in connection with new bus schedules, which look effect Tuesday at all Trailways stops between Portland and Salt Lake.

## PUBLIC NOTICE TO WATER USERS

Numerous complaints have been made to the County Court of Malheur County concerning persons willfully or negligently permitting water from irrigation and drainage ditches to waste and flow from their lands upon the right-of-way of County roads and public highways damaging the same and interfering with the public use thereof.

Section 116-1206 O. C. L. A. provides "Any person or persons, or corporation occupying land as owner, proprietor, lessee or otherwise, who willfully or negligently permits any water from any irrigation or drainage ditch to waste or flow from the lands or premises owned, occupied, leased or rented by him, upon any county road or public highway, or upon the right-of-way of any county road or public highway and damage the same, or interfere with the public use thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 60 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Justices Courts shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the Circuit Courts of all offenses committed under this Act."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the County Court of Malheur County, Oregon intends to strictly enforce this provision of the statute and that violators will be vigorously prosecuted. The cooperation of all farmers in remedying this situation is requested.
