WE NEED WATER AND STREETS

The city has not yet developed a plan of getting something for nothing, but it is offering to the people a street and water system improvement program that is about as painless as possible.

The city council proposed to issue bonds amounting to \$35,000 for paving street intersections and bonds in the amount of \$90,000 for laying new water mains and installing a second high elevation water tank. The intersection paving will be paid for out of the state gasoline tax refund and the water system improvement will be paid for from regular water revenues, so that the two projects will not cost a single

dollar of increase in taxes.

The city proposes to pay for the paving of the streets, aside from the intersections, through issuance of Bancroft bonds, which will be paid for by owners of property adjoining and adjacent to the streets to be paved. This project can not be carried out unless the \$35,000 is voted for the intersections.

In addition to the easy financing plan, the two projects have the advantage of being absolutely essential to the future development of the city. The present water mains are in bad condition because of their age and many of them are too small for the purpose for which they are intended. If the bond issue is approved, new mains will be laid in place of the present ones and the system will be extended to include more residences. The water tank will be erected in the northern part of town.

Between 7 and 8 miles of curbing will be built and from 3 to 4 miles of streets will be paved if the street improvement bond issue is approved. Such a program would pave about half of the streets.

A vote for the two bond issues at the polls June 5 will give Nyssa an opportunity to take advantage of possible future development. It cannot grow with a delapidated water system and corduroy streets.
