VOTERS WANT IMPROVEMENTS

The residents of Nyssa left no doubt in the minds of anyone that they are in favor of progress that will enable the city to meet the demands that naturally fall upon a growing community.

By an almost unprecedented majority, the voters decided by votes of 221 to 1 and 221 to 3 to issue bonds for the improvement of city streets and the water system, which is not adequate to provide sufficient water for the city.

With the paving of Main street by the state and the surfacing of three and one-half miles of other streets and enlargement of the water system, the city of Nyssa will be in a position to invite with pride the many potential businesses and individuals who might be interested in locating in a new community.

In addition to presenting a beautified city to our visitors, we will also reap benefit in the greater conveniences to be enjoyed through well kept streets and an adequate water system.

The foresight of the city council in selecting an engineer as city manager will bear fruit during this period of development. City Manager E. K. Burton's worth to the city has been demonstrated not only in his administration of municipal affairs but in preparations for the improvements that have been so wisely approved by the voters.

Those living beyond the confines of the present street improvement project are entitled to a vote of thanks by persons owning property within the area to be covered by the paving program for their approval of the bond issue. We hope they can be repaid for their fairness in the next year or two if and when the city completes paving all of the streets.

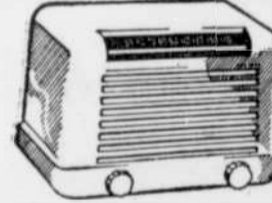
