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Stock Ponds Boost Capacity of Eastern Oregon Ranges



More than 5,000 stockwater dams have been constructed on eastern Oregon ranges under the AAA program in the past eight years. This pond on the W. C. Darrance ranch in Wallowa county has never been dry since its construction in 1940. It provides a year-around water supply for 1200 acres of bunch

grass range that can be grazed from April until late in November. County Agent Garret Best reports that this range is much better than 10 years ago. Before construction of the dam, the range was grazed heavily in the early spring when water was available, then was not used the rest of the year.
