In a double-ring ceremony before a background of gladioli and roses at the Women's Club house August 4 in Ontario, Miss Ann Brady, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. I. Brady of Nyssa, and Mr. Deane Clarkson, son of Mrs. Mina Clarkson of Eugene, were united in marriage by the Rev. K. H. Ubbelohde, pastor of the New Plymouth Congregational church. Preceding the ceremony, Miss Wilhelmina Hoffman, pianist, played Scotch Poem (MacDowell), the first movement of the Moonlight Sonata (Beethoven), Ah, Sweet Mystery of Life (Herbert), and Evening Star (Wagner).
