power to the load center at the wholesale rate and stop right there. It should not go into the retail business."
Through a discussion of the Marshall plan for the rehabilitation of Europe, Stockman said "I think Europe is in acute distress. I think we should help them up to a point. We should give them our surplus food. It is not going to be a loan; it will be a gift. First and foremost, we should investigate our own economic and financial situation. Frankly this country is broke. We are pulling that proposed 24 billion dollars for European rehabilitation out of thin air. The Europeans have strikes and sit-downs and are using their grain for liquor. Before we send those 24 billion dollars over there that situation should be straightened out".

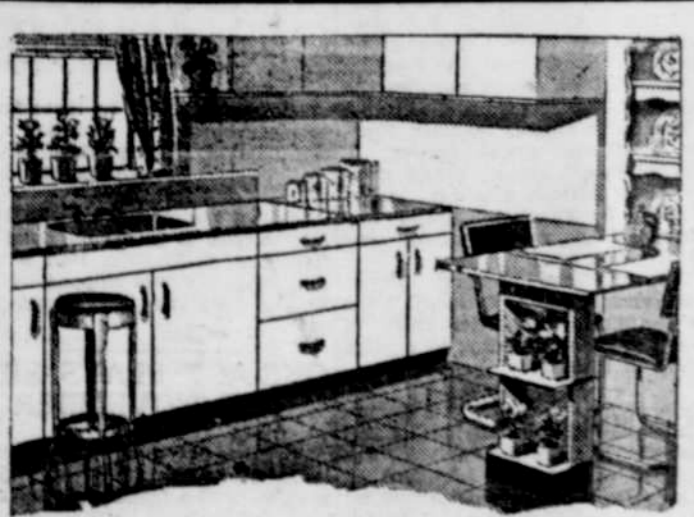
