Ellis Warner was called to Myrtle Point to be with his father who is seriously ill.

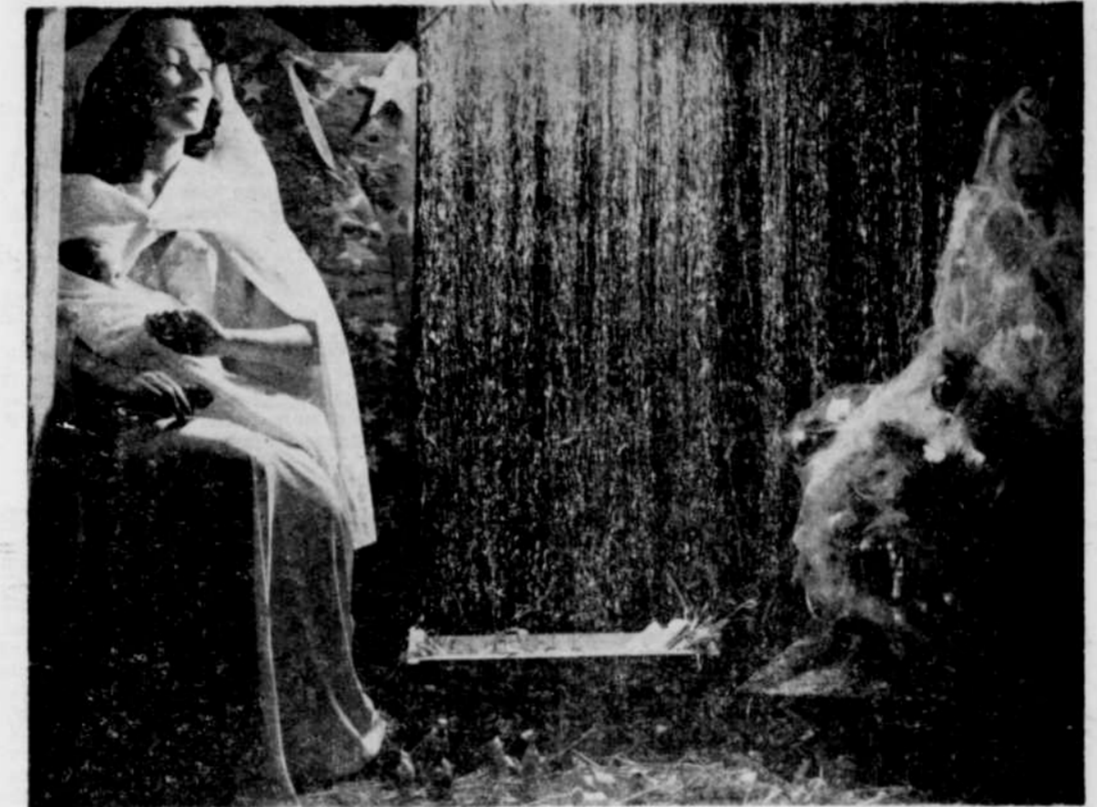
Miss Ethel Bullard of Hermiston is visiting in the Charlie Bullard home.
