Funds derived from the current Easter seal sales campaign will be used for a variety of projects in nearly every county in Oregon during the coming year. Chairman Martin P. Gallagher reported today. Expansion of the hospital school for crippled children at Eugene and

the establishment of similar facilities in other strategic locations throughout Oregon is only a part of the projected program, Gallagher said. During the past year, Gallagher stated, funds derived from the 1947 Easter seal sale were used to assist in establishing the Eugene center, to provide wheel chairs for needy handicapped, braces and artificial limbs, and surgery and medical care for others. Gallagher emphasized that all types of crippled persons, youngsters and adults included, are eligible for assistance, regardless of what type of disease or accident is responsible for their condition.

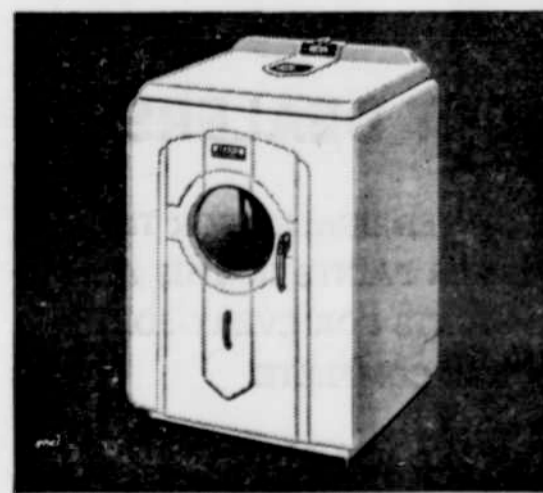

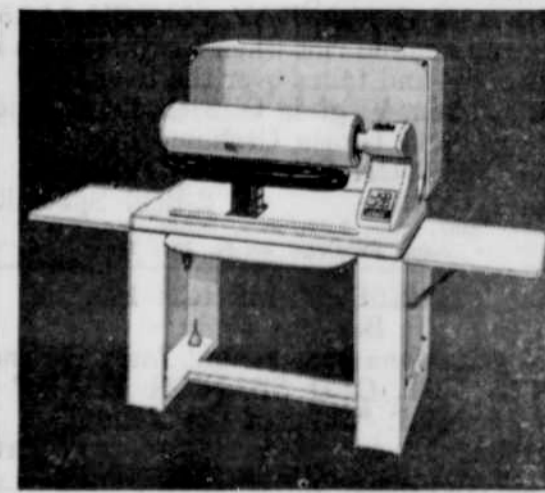
