Alongside a spur track of Union Pacific in Yakima, Wash., lies America's strangest village, "Boxville". Comprised of row upon row of tall and long buildings, "Boxville" doesn't provide shelter for a single inhabitant. Its "houses" are composed of tremendous stacks of apple boxes used in harvesting and shipping the multi-million dollar apple crop of the state of Washington. Because Yakima's warehouses couldn't begin to hold the millions of boxes, they are stacked when not in use to simulate houses as in the picture above. Roofs are added as protection against wind and rain.

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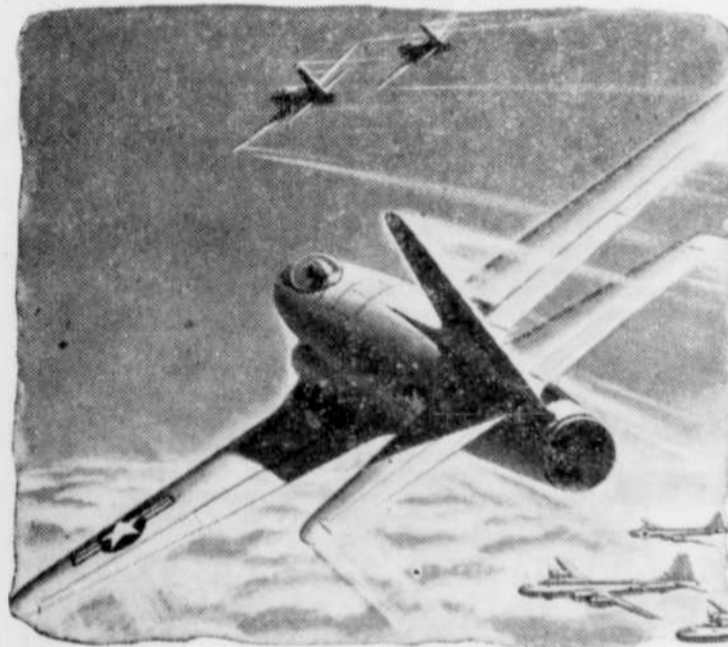
