Foster and more than 25% of the resident freeholders of certain lands, the boundaries of which are hereinafter more particularly set forth, proposing the organization of a Park and Recreation District, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 327, Oregon Law, 1941, duly filed with the County Clerk, and after a hearing on said petition and no person having appeared in opposition thereto or having objected to the boundaries of such district as proposed or having requested the inclusion of any lands therein, and upon the order of the County Court of Malheur County, Oregon, duly made and entered in its journal, the County Court has called and there will be held, within the boundaries of the proposed district, an election upon the question of whether or not such district shall be organized.

Such election will be held at the Grade School building in the City of Nyssa in said proposed district on the 26th day of May, 1948 between the hours of 8:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

At said election only resident freeholders within the proposed district, as shown by the last County assessment, shall be entitled to vote.

Foster and more than 25% of the resident freeholders of certain lands, the boundaries of which are set forth in said petition, proposing the organization of a park and recreation district pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 327, Oregon Laws, 1941, having been filed with this Court on March 23, 1948 at a special meeting and term of the County Court held on said date, and upon the filing of such petition accompanied by a bond in the sum of three hundred (\$300) dollars which was approved by the County Court and which is deemed sufficient to cover the probable cost of organizing said district and a certified copy of a resolution of the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, having been filed therewith, appropriate and the County Court having fixed a time and place for the hearing of said petition and having ordered notice of such hearing to be given by publication thereof for at least two (2) weeks in the Gate City Journal, a weekly newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, and said petition having also been published in said Gate City Journal for at least two (2) weeks and this matter having come on regularly to be heard on the 7th day of April, 1948 at the hour of 10:00 A. M., being the time fixed by the County Court for such hearing, and Harold Henigson, the attorney for the petitioner, having appeared and presented to and filed herein the affidavits of the publisher of the Gate City Journal, a newspaper published in Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, showing by said affidavits of publication that the notice of hearing and the petition herein had been given by publication thereof for two (2) successive weeks, the first publication of said notice of hearing and petition being March 25, 1948 and the second publication thereof being April 1, 1948 and said notice of hearing and petition as so published having stated the boundaries of such proposed District and said notice of hearing having stated the time and place of hearing and having required that all persons interested therein show cause why an order should not be made describing the exterior boundaries of said District as determined by said County Court and directing that an election be held in said proposed district pursuant to Chapter 327 of Oregon Laws, 1941. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECREED that the petition as presented herein be, and the same is approved and that the exterior boundaries of such proposed District shall be as follows:

DERED and DECREED that an election shall be held on Wednesday, May 26, 1948 between the hours of 8:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon of said day of election, and that there shall be one polling place, to wit: The Grade School building, in the City of Nyssa within said proposed district, and that the entire body of land embraced within the boundaries of said district as hereinbefore described, shall constitute one voting precinct for the purpose of said election.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED and DECREED that the Clerk of this Court shall give notice of said election so to be held, by publication of notice of election once each week for at least four (4) successive weeks, being five (5) consecutive publications prior to the date of the holding of such election, in the Gate City Journal, a newspaper published in Nyssa, Oregon, and having a general circulation within the boundaries of the proposed district and that the notice so published shall describe the boundaries of the proposed district, shall designate the name of the proposed district and shall notify the resident freeholders of said proposed district that they will be required to cast ballots containing the words "I vote in favor of the creation of Nyssa Community Park and Recreation District" or "I vote against the creation of Nyssa Community Park and Recreation District" or words equivalent thereto, and shall also give notice of the date, time and place where such election will be held.
