

**7 TUBERCULOSIS CASES ARE FOUND**

The report of the 1947 X-ray survey held in Malheur county last September has just been received, according to Margaret Beattie, executive secretary of the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health Association.

Out of the 1661 films taken, seven positive cases of tuberculosis were found, four of minimal lesions and three moderately advanced cases. Fifty-eight cases of non-tuberculosis pathology, including such things as cancer and heart, lung and rib abnormalities, were discovered.

"Of the total number of films taken, 21 percent were of children, 14 years of age or under. This is a situation we hope to correct this year," said Dr. L. A. Maulding, county health officer. "As the re-infection type of tuberculosis which we are looking for is extremely rare in children it is poor business to X-ray large numbers of children. This fall we hope to X-ray far more adults and fewer children. The seven positive cases found in last

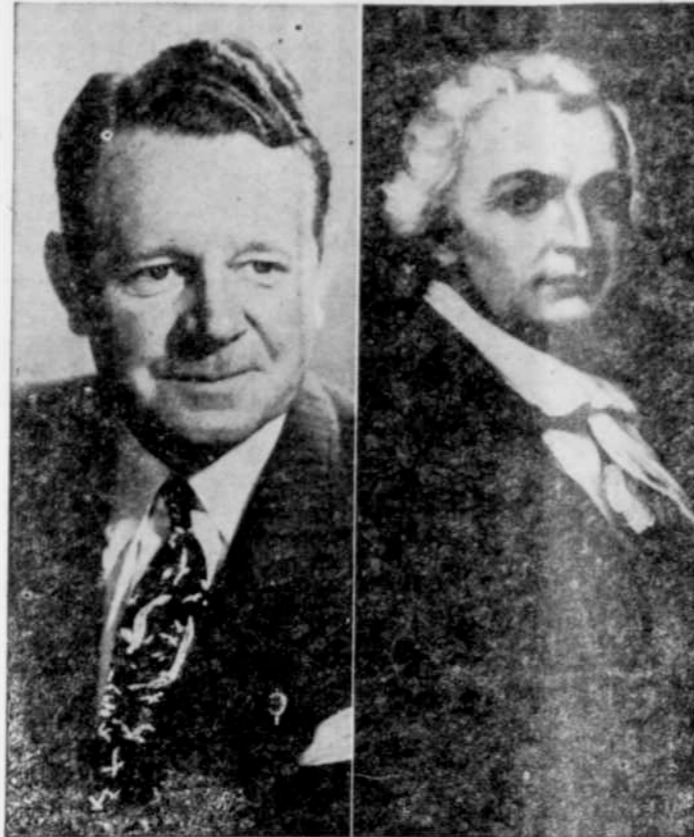
year's survey were all adults, ranging in age from 20 to 69 years."

The X-ray survey is planned for the middle of October, the exact dates to be determined at a meeting July 23 of representatives of the four sponsoring agencies, the county and state tuberculosis and health associations and the county and state health departments.

According to Dr. Maulding the X-ray survey is an excellent method of picking up early cases of tuberculosis which are not found in other ways. The earlier a case is found the greater the chance of recovery. The seven cases found in last fall's survey were all early or only moderately advanced cases. Since early tuberculosis rarely shows any signs or symptoms those people probably did not know before that they had the disease, Dr. Maulding said.

Meeting with Mrs. Margaret Blackburn, a representative of Community Concert Service, a branch of the world's largest concert agency, Columbia Concerts, Inc., of New York, a group of Malheur county citizens organized the association as a preliminary step in establishing a permanent concert series here on a business-like basis.

Chosen to head the new organization as president was Lynn MacLachlan, who said the plan involves a membership campaign which has been scheduled to start September

After the close of the membership campaign, the local committee will choose the artists for the coming season from a list that includes virtually all the major concert groups, singers, and instrumentalists now before the public, the president said.

The formation of the Malheur County Community Concert association will add another to the hundreds of cities and towns in the United States and Canada annually enjoying the talents of leading professional musicians on a basis that guarantees the local organization from deficit, leaders said.

Mr. MacLachlan pointed out that all the membership dues of the non-profit association will be used for the purpose of engaging the artists and defraying the small campaign expenses.
