

BRAND BOOKS ARE AVAILABLE IN CO.

More than 14,000 Oregon livestock brands are contained in the new brand book issued by the Oregon state department of agriculture for the benefit of livestock owners and individuals and concerns dealing in and with animals. The book contains all brands issued since 1940, with a special section showing transfers in that period.

In order to assist livestockmen in procuring the books, the department has placed a supply in the hands of Roy Nelson, its livestock theft prevention officer in this district, according to word from M. E. Knickerbocker, chief of the division of animal industry. Nelson works out of Vale and may be contacted either at his home in Vale or through the county agent's office.

The book contains brands and transfers filed with the department up to late 1946 and a supplement supplied with all orders for the book contains registrations between that period and the first of this year. The 14,000 recordings include brands and marks of cattle, horses, sheep, goats, mules, poultry, fox and hogs.

In addition to the 70-page master index, which is arranged alphabetically by names of brand owners, the books contains 357 pages of brand and mark recordings. A drawing of each brand, wattle or dulp, location of the brand and name and address of the owner are contained in the information relative to each recording.

The cost of the new brand book is \$5, which includes the supplement and any additional supplements which may be issued. Purchase may be made either direct from Roy Nelson at Vale or through the division of animal industry, state department of agriculture, Salem.

HOMESTEADS OPEN TO ENTRY SOON

Five hundred and twenty-two homesteads comprising 51,000 acres in Wyoming, Idaho and Washington and on the Oregon-California border are expected to be opened to public entry this summer and fall, with war veterans given first priority, the federal bureau of reclamation informed the Oregon department of veterans' affairs this week.

Dates of opening are tentative, the Sacramento regional director said, but those interested were advised to write the three regional offices of the bureau of reclamation and ask to be placed on the mailing lists for public notices. These offices, and the projects they cover, include:

At Boise, Idaho for the following three: Boise project, Payette division, spring, 70 units, 7000 acres; Minidoka project, Gooding division, spring, 45 units, 4500 acres; Yakima project, Roza division, fall, 15 units, 700 acres.

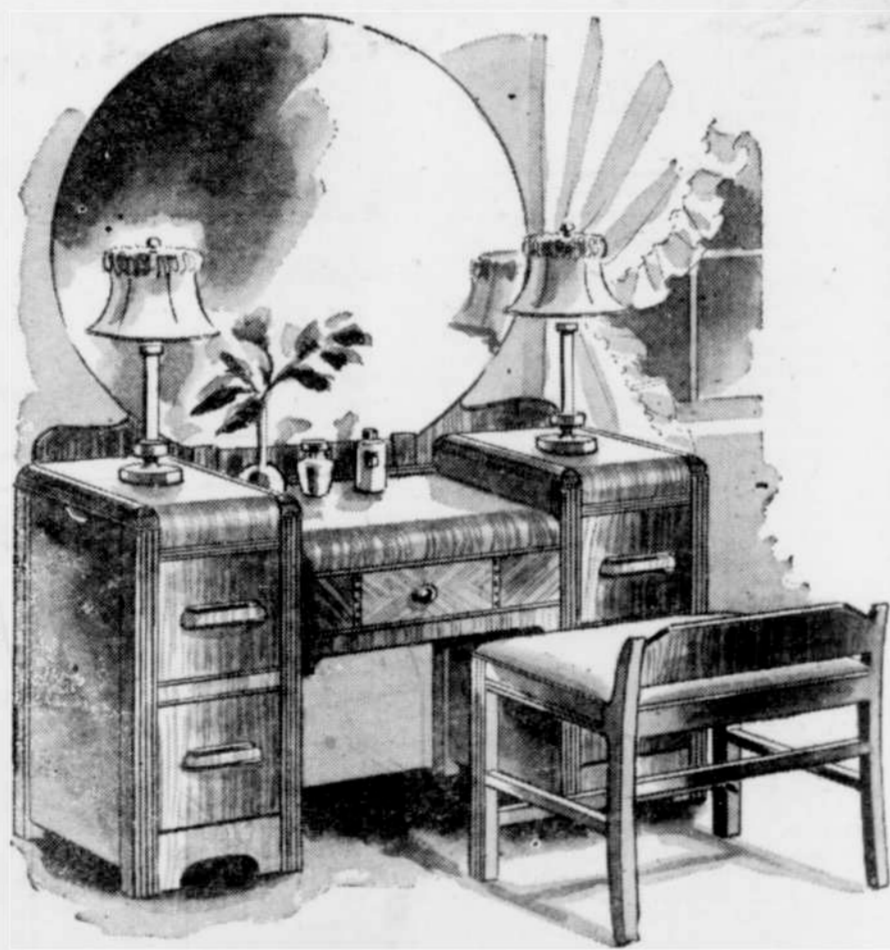
