Mr. and Mrs. Bob Webster and family visited Mr. Webster's parents in Parma Sunday.

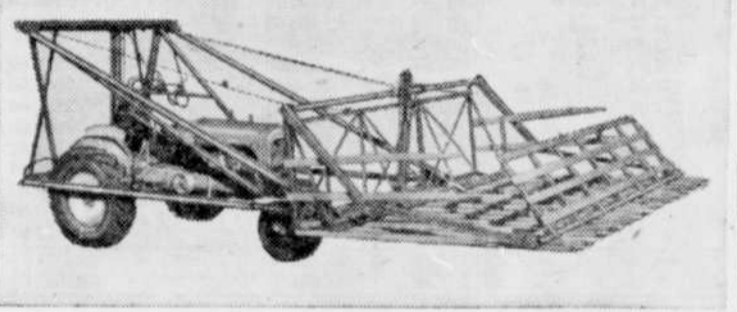
