Notice is hereby given that on the 11th day of May, 1948 the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon at its regular session, adopted a Resolution in proceedings to vacate certain portions of City streets and alleys of the City of Nyssa, Oregon in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, and the portions of the City street and alleys which are more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

- (1) That portion of Oregon Street commencing at the East line of Seventh Street, running thence Northwesterly to the intersection of Oregon Street with the West line of Fifth Street and the South line of Locust Avenue.
(2) All of Pine Avenue which commences at the West line of First Street, and thence west to the East line of Third Street.
