## Grandstand and Yards Enlarged

The Owyhee Riding club, originator of the Nyssa night rodeo, has made several improvements at the rodeo grounds since last year's event.

The club has doubled the capacity of the grandstand, which has been painted white by the members of the organization. The grandstand will seat 2400 persons so that with bleacher seats the capacity for the show is expected to be approximately 3500. The club replaced the burned section of the grandstand and added two new sections.

The club also doubled the capacity of the corrals for watering and feeding rodeo livestock and white-washed all of the fencing. The workers installed a new type of calf chute with spring doors, a new water system for watering livestock and new additional lights.

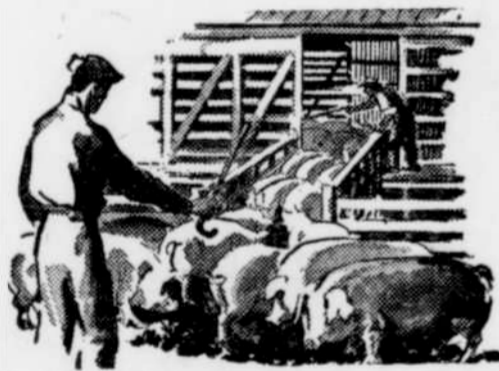
