Frank Van Meter was second in 56.4 seconds, Harry Charters of Melba third in 118.1, and Bob Witty of Enterprise fourth in 180.2. The best time for today money was made by Fess Reynolds, who downed a steer in 11.4 seconds. He missed his steer the first day to ruin his average.  
Jack Percifield of Arizona won

the calf-roping with an average time of 39.3 for the two days. He made a time both nights of 19.4 seconds. Sherman Sullins of California was second in 39.4, Jake Dyer of Nampa third in 40.2, and Fess Reynolds fourth in 51.2. Sullins registered the best time for day money (July 24) with 14.2 seconds.

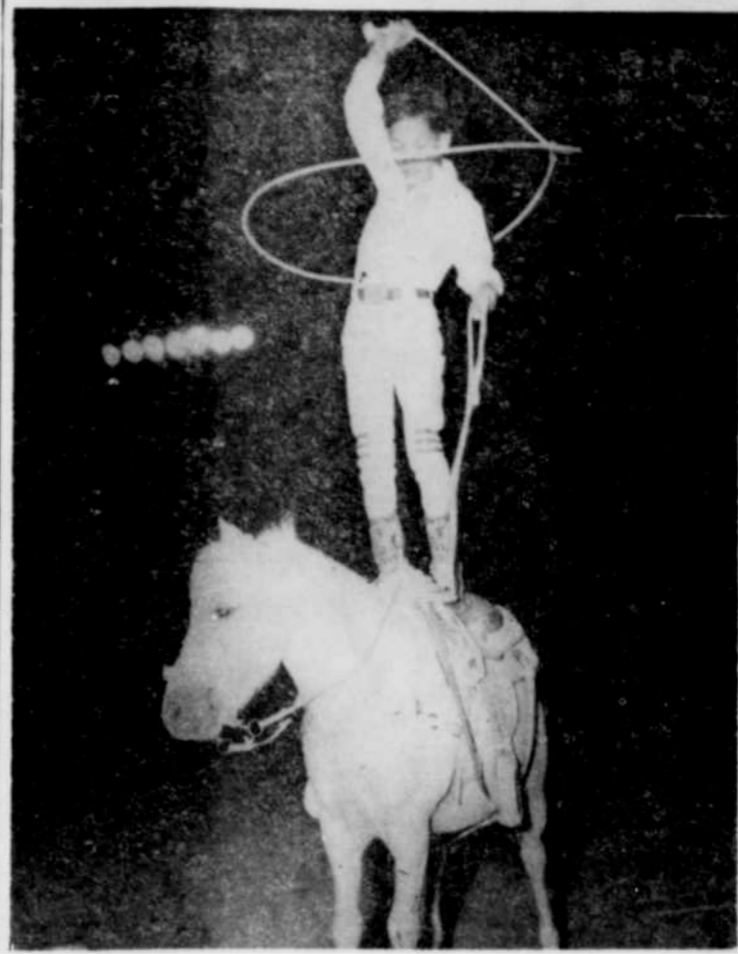

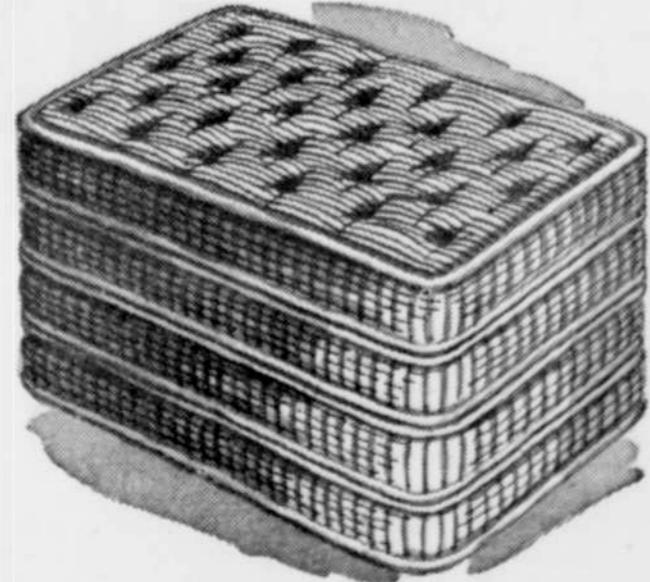
