OUR NO. 1 CITIZEN IS GONE

Aside from his ability, Frank T. Morgan became the No. 1 citizen of Nyssa and an influential leader in a much larger area principally because he took an active part in the development of Malheur county, the state of Oregon and the Snake river valley.

In practically every phase of his life, Frank Morgan was identified with development. In fact, his life was the very symbol of development and progress. Mr. Morgan, who died at his home last week-end, came to Malheur county from Wisconsin when he was a young man and took a position as a school teacher in Nyssa. After a short time he purchased a ranch at Kingman Colony and for that purchase many people questioned his intelligence, he said. After developing that place, he purchased the farm where he spent his last days and again he was called "crazy" for buying a place in such poor condition. However, during the last few years he has been taking high yields of sugar beets from the farm and other crops in like proportion.

For many years, Mr. Morgan was identified with reclamation, one of the most important factors in the development of the west and took an active interest in the development of highways at a time when the state of Oregon was engaged in an extensive highway construction program. He was influential in the decision of the Amalgamated Sugar company officials to locate a plant in Nyssa. Mr. Morgan worked many hours and spent many dollars in efforts to secure other industries and businesses for this community.

In addition to his individual activities, Mr. Morgan was habitually identified with organizations that traditionally seek the development

of the sections in which they operate. He was secretary of the Nyssa chamber of commerce for more than 20 years and during that time gained a wide acquaintance, which benefitted this community. He was president of the Associated chambers of commerce of Southwestern Idaho and Eastern Oregon and president of the Oregon Reclamation congress, which have long been interested in the development of their respective territories.

Mr. Morgan belonged to many other organizations, but he gained his fame through working with groups identified with progress. He fell as a martyr to progress, because he worked too intensely and diligently for it. Nyssa has lost its most prominent citizen, a man who never spoke a sharp word to a friend, and his absence will be sorely felt. He was only 59 years old, 'Tis a shame he passed away before the Nyssa that he helped "raise" had reached the peak of its development. With his life as an example, the rest of us should be able to co-operate more effectively in the development of our community.
