\$2,031 Paid For Local 4-H Stock

Members of 4-H clubs of Malheur county received \$2,031.73 for their fat steers sold through the 4-H auction sale at the Pacific International Livestock exposition last week. Highest price for calves from this county went to Virginia Mallet of White Settlement and Larry Fivecoat of Owyhee when their calves brought \$36.25 per cwt. in the sales ring. The greatest total amount for any one calf went to George Ferguson of Willowreek when his Angus brought \$379.85.

The six calves from this county had a total weight of 5,780 pounds, which brought the club members an average of 35 cents straight through. This amounted to four cents above top Portland prices.

In addition to the sale of their calves, club members will receive \$26, in premiums for the placings their animals made when the livestock was judged. The calves belonging to Frances Peik, Virginia Mallet, and Larry Fivecoat were all graded as choice, and the calves owned by George Ferguson and Wilma Purvis were graded as good.

In addition to exhibiting and selling their calves, club members from this county took part in the livestock judging contest, and in the fitting and showmanship contest. George Ferguson placed ninth in a class of 32 in the Angus division of the fitting and showmanship contest.

According to W. E. Ross of Steamboat Springs, Colorado, who judged the beef classes, quality of the exhibits this year was especially good. The champion 4-H club steer placed over the champion in the F. F. A department and over the open class champion to become grand champion of the entire show. This grand champion was a shorthorn fed out by Jack Bennett of Winona, Washington.

Due to the shortage of space, the number of exhibits was somewhat smaller than in the past but this helped improve the quality as only the top animals from the different counties were taken to Portland. A total of 270 beef animals, 34 head of sheep, and 124 hogs were exhibited in the 4-H club fat classes.

LOWER PRICES FOR FOOD ANTICIPATED

Lower food prices are on their way as a result of record farm production," in the opinion of Charles Taylor, president of Malheur County Farm Bureau.

"The record farm production," stated Taylor, "was made possible by price support programs authorized by congress to encourage farm output."

The following statement of the American Farm Bureau Federation, the National Grange, and National Council of Farmers Cooperatives

was cited. "The present downward trend in many farm commodities will be reflected in grocery and meat counters as the products of this year's bumper crops reach markets in increasing volume.

"Consumer prices have not yet reflected the declines averaging about 10 per cent in farm prices from the high point earlier this year.

"Lower prices for meats and other animal products are to be expected as the lower-priced and more plentiful grains are reflected in additional livestock production. But this will take time.

"Livestock numbers have been cut sharply in recent years to make more grain available for European aid, and it will take time to rebuild livestock herds to fully utilize the more abundant grain supplies.

"The decline in farm prices can only partially be reflected to consumers so long as processing, transportation and other handling costs remain at present levels or continue to rise.

"The support program designed to assure ample supplies has kept food prices from reaching the heights which they would have reached and did reach in many other countries. Supports are insurance that a farm price collapse will not plunge the entire economy into a depression, as it did in 1920-21 and 1930-31.

"The average of farm prices, with the exception of livestock and livestock products, has dropped about 20 per cent since January and now is below parity.

"The present high level of government expenditures, taxes, and national debt provide a broad field for development of fiscal and monetary policies which would contribute to price level stability.
