Hope, republican, unopposed; non-partisan—judge of the state supreme court, position No. 1, Percy R. Kelly, unopposed incumbent; judge of the supreme court, position No. two, James T. Brand, unopposed incumbent and county school superintendent, Dennis Patch of Nyssa and Kathryn Claypool of Vale, incumbent, and city councilmen of Nyssa, four to be elected, R. G. Whitaker, George C. Henneman, Emil Stunz, and Harry Miner, incumbents, and Robert Talbot, Jr., Elden Vergensen, Gordon Ray and Murlie Marcum.

Four of the city candidates will be elected, three for four year terms and one for a two-year term.

PHEASANT CROP SAME AS IN '47

respect to hunters. These posters will be distributed throughout the area.

"The bag limit of pheasants is two per day and not more than six during the entire season. The season will extend from noon October 29 to November 7. Shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset except the noon opening on October 29.

"No Hungarian partridge, valley quail, mountain quail or bob white quail are permitted to be taken.

"The waterfowl season will open the same day and time as pheasant season in Malheur county. A partially concurrent pheasant season in Idaho and Malheur county should improve hunting conditions along the Snake river."

The elk season in both western and eastern Oregon also opened this week, October 25. The season east of The Dalles-California highway will continue through November 11.
