CREAMERY ISSUES CHECKS, GREETINGS

Along with the season's greetings, the Farmers' Co-operative Creamery company of Payette has issued checks to patrons for milk and cream delivered from January 1 to October 31, 1948. Checks totaling \$110,000 have been distributed to the 2500 patrons of the creamery. The checks represent additional

cash payment of five cents per pound butterfat in milk or two cents per pound butterfat in cream. In its letter to patrons, the company said in part: "This year in 1948 we have retired, paid in full, all of 1937 and 1938 equity credits. Your board of directors have also authorized an additional payment of five cents per pound on butterfat received in milk and two cents per pound butterfat received in cream for the first 10 months of this year, which means

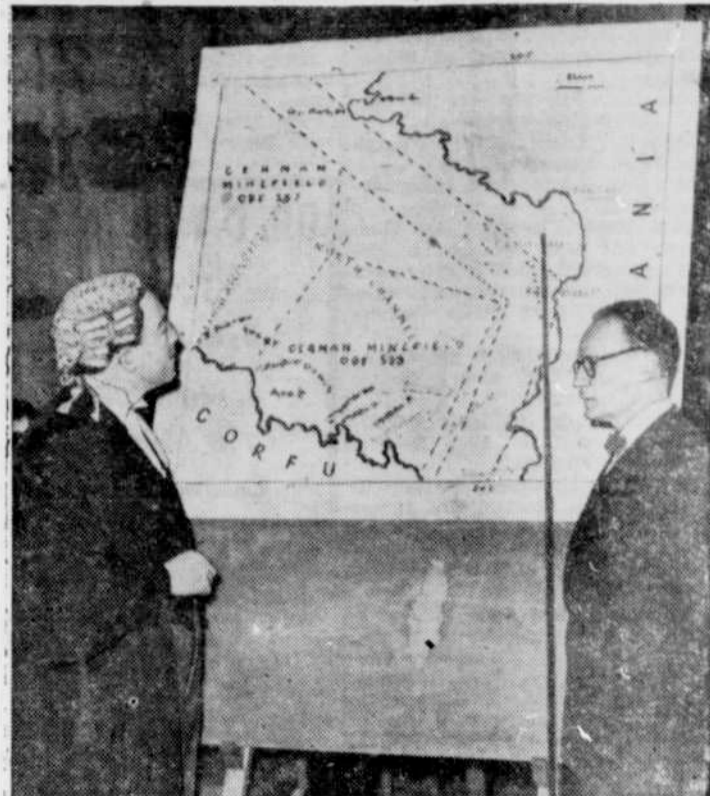

SCHOLARSHIPS ARE OFFERED BY P. T. A.

The Malheur County P. T. A. would like to acquaint more high school students and graduates with the Tuition Scholarship project which is for the purpose of attracting the attention of superior young men and women to the teaching profession in the elementary schools of Oregon.

Scholarships are available to high school seniors or graduates and college students or graduates who wish to train for teaching in the elementary public schools of Oregon. Their training must take place in Oregon public tax-supported teacher training institutions, of which there are three at the present time: the Oregon College of Education at Monmouth, the Eastern Oregon College of Education at La Grande, and the Southern Oregon College of Education at Ashland. Scholarships may be renewed, upon application, for a period of four years, providing the applicant meets the standards anticipated in the award of the scholarships. The applicant must agree to complete a full course in elementary teacher education and teach in the public elementary schools of Oregon at least one year for each year of scholarship received.

Applications for next year's awards must be completed by April 15. Upon completion, they are forwarded to the Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers which checks and makes awards to the highest qualified applicants. Twenty-four young men and women entered training on P. T. A. scholarships

this year. Young men or women interested in this scholarship may contact their school principal, the president of their local P. T. A. or Mrs. Dick Jensen, president of the Malheur County P. T. A. for additional information.
