LEGAL NOTICE OF VACATION OF STREETS AND ALLEYS.

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th day of November, 1948 the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon at its regular session, adopted a Resolution in proceedings to vacate certain portions of City streets and alleys of the City of Nyssa, Oregon in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, and the portions of the City street and alleys which are more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

(1) All that portion of the Alley in Block 86, Westfield Addition to the City of Nyssa, Oregon, lying between the West line of Seventh Street and the Easterly line of the Oregon State Highway Right of Way.

(2) That portion of Ennis Avenue commencing at the West line of Fifth street and running thence west to the East line of Sixth Street extended North.

and reserving at all times easements and right-of-way over, across and under said property and the whole thereof for the purpose of installation, repair and operating City Sewers and any and all other City facilities and public utilities.

Notice is further given that the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Oregon has fixed the 11th day of January, 1949 at the hour of 8:00 P. M. as the time, and the City Hall in the City of Nyssa, Oregon as the place for hearing and considering said Resolution and for hearing and considering said Resolution and for hearing and considering any objections made in writing and filed with the City Recorder, that may be made to the vacating said portions of streets and alleys, and for determining whether notice has been duly given and whether the public interest will be prejudiced by the vacation of said streets and alleys, and such other matters which are required by law to be passed upon and determined by the City Council at said time.

All persons and owners affected by said vacation and desiring to object to said vacation shall present their objections to the City Recorder of the City of Nyssa as by law required.

VALE WATER USERS TO CONTROL SYSTEM

Water users in the Vale federal reclamation project soon will take charge of canals, laterals and other water distributing facilities used to cover the project's 32,000 acres. R. L. Newell, regional reclamation director, Sunday had been advised by the secretary of the interior that the water facilities of the Vale project will be operated by the water users beginning January 1, 1949.

The Vale irrigation district will have charge of operating the 32,000-acre system of canals and laterals.

Water distribution facilities now are being operated by reclamation personnel, paid out of trust funds set up in advance by the irrigators, Newell said.

The bureau of reclamation explained that the policy of having water users operate the facilities instead of reclamation personnel is part of the congressional program to cut down federal expenses.

Michael W. Straus, commissioner of reclamation, said the federal bureau has followed a policy laid down long ago by congress and the department of interior to turn over water distributing facilities to local water users.

At the same time commissioner of Reclamation Michael W. Straus pointed out that "from time to time, there has been some comment on our operation of irrigation facilities from various water users or organizations. This has grown largely out of the increasing costs of project operation and maintenance. The water users now have full opportunity to take over the operation of these facilities themselves and under their own responsibility demonstrate what they can do with them. The bureau has only been carrying on the operations at the water users request."

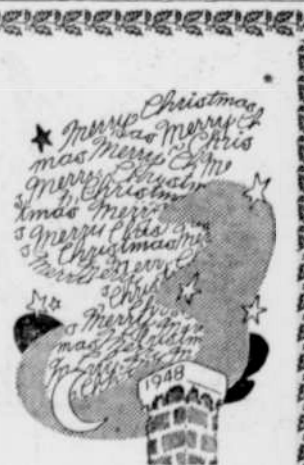
Mrs. Borge reported the local library, sponsored by the P. T. A., is now located in the Ashcraft store in Adrian.

SALE OF CHRISTMAS SEALS IS UNDERWAY

The annual Christmas seal sale of the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health association is now in progress, according to Ted Berreth, president.

"Seals have been sent out to cover 3,000 families in the county and we are hoping everyone who can will respond by sending in their money before Christmas," he said. Augmenting the Christmas seal sale is the sale of "health bonds," which come in denominations of from \$5 to \$50. Businesses and clubs have already been asked to purchase bonds and any individual who wishes to contribute to the work of the health association by buying one may do so by contacting the Ontario office or his local seal sale chairman.

According to Mrs. E. K. Burton, Nyssa chairman, seals and bonds are on sale every afternoon in the office of the Nyssa Insurance company and will be on sale every afternoon from now until Christmas.

Health bond and Christmas seal money paid for x-raying over 4,000 persons in Malheur county last year provided health literature and films to all schools and many clubs, and supported a successful educational program to interest the county court in establishing a full-time health unit. It also helped support a medical research program and a program of social hygiene guidance in the home, according to Margaret Beattie, executive secretary.

The association hopes that sufficient money will be raised this year to carry on another extensive x-ray program next fall.
