D. 1949, between the hours of 2:00 o'clock P. M. and 7:00 o'clock P. M. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bond indebtedness in the sum of \$51,500.00 for the purpose of providing the funds needed for constructing an Elementary School in and for said District and for furnishing and equipping said Elementary School and for acquiring real property as an addition to the present Elementary School grounds within said District.
