He also planted about an acre of melons and hot capped all of it. Charlie Mayberry has returned from Nampa to water his crops. E. E. Eastman has been sick but is recovering.

MUCH HOSPITAL PROGRESS MADE

Many members, associate members and interested persons have been visiting the Malheur Memorial hospital that is now under construction on Alberta avenue. Leslie W. Stoker contractor, stated that everyone is invited to inspect the hospital to see the progress that is being made and in that way learn how the money is being spent. The question has been asked why there is no floor in the west wing. Mr. Stoker is holding up the work on this floor because the plumbing and heating contractor's employees are on strike and he has to lay pipes under the floor before it can be completed. This floor will have a concrete base with ceramic tile

covering. The reason this floor is different from the rest is because it is the surgical wing and the flooring has to be constructed in this manner so the entire wing will be grounded. Due to the inflammability of anesthesia, every precaution has to be taken against explosions. Mr. Stoker believed at first that the hospital would be completed June 1, but due to the fact that the plumbing and heating work has been delayed, it will not be completed until July 1, but as soon as the strike is settled, work will resume at full speed. The electrical contractor has accomplished much in the last few weeks. The air conditioning system is going in rapidly. It is set up in such a way, that fresh air will be circulated through the hospital at all times. It will be heated or

cooled, according to the season, to the correct temperature. Much mill work is being done on the walls, which will be filled into the walls, making an even wall. The boiler had to be made to order and has been delayed for some time, but should be here within 10 days. When it is installed the rest of the wall can be completed and the remainder of the roof constructed. The corridors will be sound-proof, as well as the nursery, the delivery and labor rooms, so that footsteps and all other sounds will be deadened. Consequently, the patients in the hospital will not be disturbed.

Takes Job in Japan—
From Tokyo comes word that Raymond A. Hashitani, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. K. Hashitani of Nyssa, has accepted appointment as price control official in the economic section of the eighth army at Urawa, Japan. Hashitani went to Japan as food specialist of the U. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 10th day of May, 1949, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M., the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, at its regular meeting thereof, to be held at the Council Chamber, at City Hall, Nyssa, Oregon, will meet and hold a public hearing to hear and consider objections and protests, if any, to the proposed action of the City Council to amend Section 7 of Ordinance No. 299, as amended, insofar as it prohibits the construction, erection, operation and maintenance of any additional garages where gasoline, distillate and oils are kept and

stored for sale at retail, in certain portions of Zone 3, which relates to the "Business District." NOTICE IS ALSO HEREBY GIVEN that at a regular meeting duly convened on the 12th day of April, 1949, the City Council, on its own motion, resolved to amend the second paragraph of Section 7 of Ordinance No. 299, as amended, which reads as follows:

"The construction, erection, operation and maintenance of any additional garages and/or filling stations where gasoline, distillate and oils are kept and stored for sale at retail will be prohibited in that portion of Zone 3, Business District, within the following boundaries, to-wit: Between the center line of Good Avenue and the center line of Bower Avenue and between the center line of First Street and the center line of the State Highways leading toward Adrian and Ontario, Oregon, respectively."

so as to revise the prohibition against the construction, erection, operation and maintenance of any additional garages where gasoline, distillate and oils are kept and stored for sale at retail within the above described portion of Zone 3, Business District.

All persons and owners of properties affected by or interested in the said proposed amendment of said Section 7 of Ordinance No. 299, as amended, who have objections to the same shall present their written objections and protests to the City Recorder of the
