

Cattlemen Of County Gather

One hundred and twenty cattlemen and their wives gathered in Jordan valley at a semi-annual meeting of the Malheur County Livestock association last Saturday. The new brand law and prospective recommendations for action at the state cattlemen's meeting next week in Pendleton were the main topics of discussion.

Roy Nelson, livestock theft investigator, told of the differences in this new brand law over the old

one that has been in effect two years. The primary difference, Nelson explained, is that a maximum charge of 25 cents per head is to be charged for inspection which is to be reduced as soon as it is feasible to meet expenses with less money. Cattle in normal ranch operations can be moved on the hoof without transportation certificates but when moved by truck or rail, the cattle must be accompanied by a transportation certificate or a brand inspection certificate.

Any time cattle cross a state line, according to Nelson, they must be accompanied by a brand inspection certificate. If, as is the case in

this and other state border counties, the same cattle are brought back into the state without unloading or changing ownership enroute, during a normal ranch operation, the owner of the cattle can apply to the director for a refund within 30 days. This has to be done on a regular form provided by the department of agriculture. As long as cattle stay within the state they can be transported to market with a transportation certificate and get the brand inspection at the point of destination any place enroute. No brand inspections will be made, however, on cattle in trucks. They must be unloaded for proper inspection.

Nelson explained that brands must be recorded every five years for a fee of \$5. In the past, brands were registered every 10 years for one dollar. This new regulation on brand registration was recommended over a year ago by the Malheur County Livestock association to help eliminate dead irons and to raise additional funds for brand work in the state.

The livestock association also recommended that the stray law, which was not acted on by the legislature, be brought before the state brand committee and prepared for consideration at the next session of the legislature. Dr. Charles Haynes, state veterinarian, discussed livestock disease problems with the group. The association is anxious to inaugurate an official Bang's vaccination in the county and to do everything possible to get the county back on a T. B. accredited basis. This would necessitate 10 percent of all of the cattle in the county being T. B. tested. If this were done, cattle could be shipped from Malheur county to other states for breeding stock without the now required health certificates.

Dorman Turner, secretary of the state cattlemen's association, issued

an invitation for all Malheur county cattlemen to attend their meeting in Pendleton May 16, 17, and 18.

The Malheur County Cowbells gave an excellent lunch for those present at the meeting. During the evening a dance was held at the high school to supply a full day of business and pleasure for those attending the meeting.

ACADEMY OPENINGS WILL BE AVAILABLE

Congressman Lowell Stockman of the second district of Oregon will have two vacancies at the U. S. Military academy, West Point, New York, for the class beginning July 1, 1950. He will also have one vacancy for the same class at the U. S. Naval academy, Annapolis, Maryland. Applicants for these vacancies must be residents of the second district of Oregon.

He will have competitive examinations conducted by the civil service commission Monday, July 11, 1949, to aid in the selection of the nominees for both academies. Candidates for the military academy must be between the ages of 17 and 22 years at the date of admission (July 1, 1950). Candidates for the naval academy must be not less than 17 years of age nor more than 21 years of age on April 1 of the calendar year, (1950) in which they enter the naval academy.

These age requirements are statutory and cannot be waived, except in cases of candidates who have served honorably for not less than one year in any of the armed forces of the United States during World War II. In such cases, a candidate may enter the military academy provided he has not passed his 24th birthday on the first of July in the year during which he would enter the military academy, and he can enter the naval academy if he is not more than 23 years of age on April 1 of the calendar year in which he enters that academy.

Applicants must be unmarried, should be high school seniors, or graduates of high school, or college students, and in perfect physical condition. All boys who are interested and qualified should write immediately to Congressman Lowell Stockman, House Office building, Washington, D. C., so that they may receive additional information and be admitted to the examination.
