PARKING CORRECTLY

After a waiting period of several months following the paving of Nyssa's Main street, the state highway department has painted parking stalls on certain sections of the street for the convenience of motorists.

The stalls are long enough for easy parallel parking within the two extremities and there should be no excuse for anyone parking over the white lines designating the parking area. However, many are not parking correctly and thus take more space for their automobile than they are entitled to. Parking correctly is a convenience not only to each motorist, but also to his fellow-drivers. Remembering this fact will give drivers a chance to utilize every possible parking space.

As another traffic regulation, the city of Nyssa has passed an ordinance providing for one hour parking on Main street between the post office and Third street and for 10 minute parking in front of and at the side of the post office. This move is also designed to help motorists by providing more parking space. However, the provision will be worthless unless motorists observe the new regulation and police officers enforce it. When the signs go up, parking law violations must end.
