MRS. DUNBAR SPEAKS

Members of the county board of the Malheur Tuberculosis and Health association heard Sadie Orr Dunbar, executive secretary of the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health association warn against relinquishing their fight against tuberculosis. Mrs. Dunbar stated that the waiting list at the tuberculosis hospitals is gradually increasing.

The group, which met at the Moore hotel Monday evening, were reminded by Mrs. Dunbar of the history of the present health organization that was formed in Portland in 1915. Mrs. Dunbar has been the executive secretary for 34 years. Mrs. Dunbar explained the organization set up of the Oregon Tuberculosis and health association in which the balance of power remains

in the local county associations. Oregon has a death rate of 20.3, which is the 10th lowest in the United States.

Mrs. June Davis, executive secretary of the Malheur Tuberculosis and Health association, reported at Monday's meeting that there were to be 200 follow-up x-rays in Malheur county.
