

Stations For Bird Checking Arranged

The Oregon state game commission announced today that checking stations for the convenience of pheasant hunters in Malheur county will be operated at Ontario,

Huntington, Vale, Juntura, Brogan, and Nyssa. Upland bird regulations for 1949 state, "Any upland game birds to be transported through or possessed in a closed area or area of lesser bag limit must be checked by a state officer in the area in which they were legally taken. The officer will record

the date and county of kill on the hunter's license. It shall be unlawful to possess more than the legal bag limit of upland game birds in any area unless license is marked to indicate that the birds in possession were killed in an area where such a possession limit is legal. Limits may be checked at any game commission or state police station or by any state officer in the field with in the county or area where such bag limits apply".

The pheasant outlook for the season, which will open at noon October 21, is better state-wide than it has been for several years, a commission spokesman stated. Highest success is expected to be in Umatilla and Malheur counties.
