Keith Lane, of the Kingman Colony area, has enrolled in the Nampa Business college. He registered for an 18-month course in business administration.

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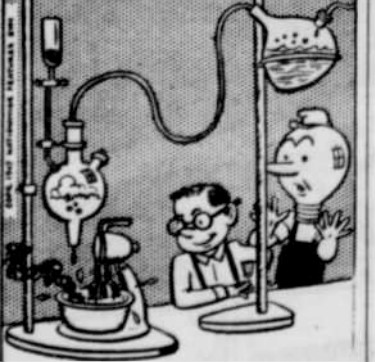
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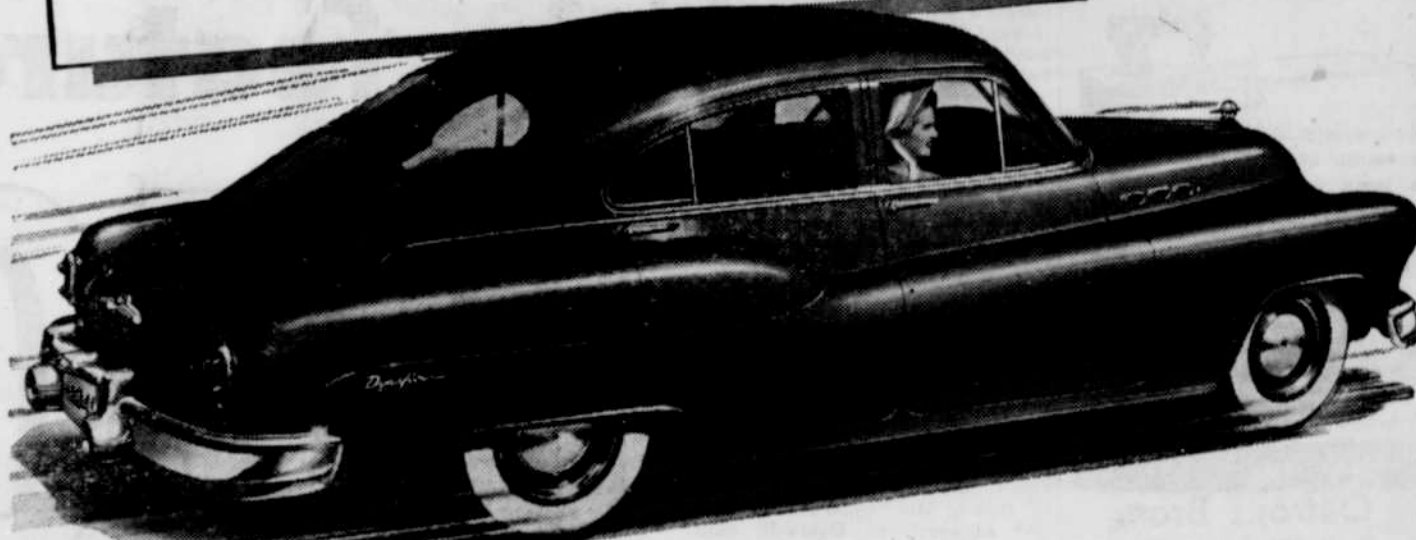
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
