New Fire Truck Ready For Use

been approved by the people of the district.

The fire district is now working on plans for a farm numbering system and index map. Until they are completed, persons having fires are cautioned to give complete information regarding the location of a farm and the route from the fire station. The plans will probably be finished in about three weeks.

The new equipment of the district is called a 600-gallon triple combination class A pumper, tested and approved by the fire underwriters bureau. It is also equipped with a high pressure positive displacement pump, operating two booster reels. The primary use of the booster set-up is to fight fires inside dwellings, using a high pressure fog. The use of fog is a new method of fire fighting that cuts water damage to a minimum. The truck carries 500 gallons of water in a tank. The machine can be used to pump water from ditches, wells and other farm sources of water supply. The truck is equipped with all auxiliary equipment, making it one of the most modern in the valley, either for city or rural use. The machine carries 1000 feet of 2½ inch fire hose, 500 feet of 1½ inch hose and 400 feet of one inch high pressure hose. The city of Nyssa enlarged the fire station so that the new rural truck could be housed therein.

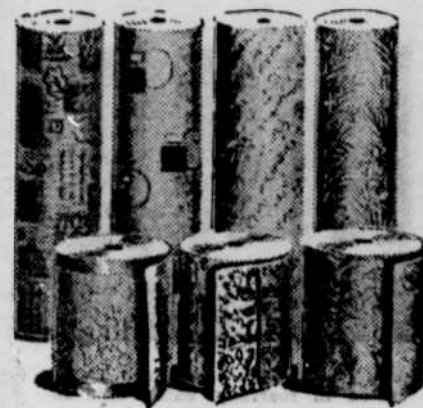

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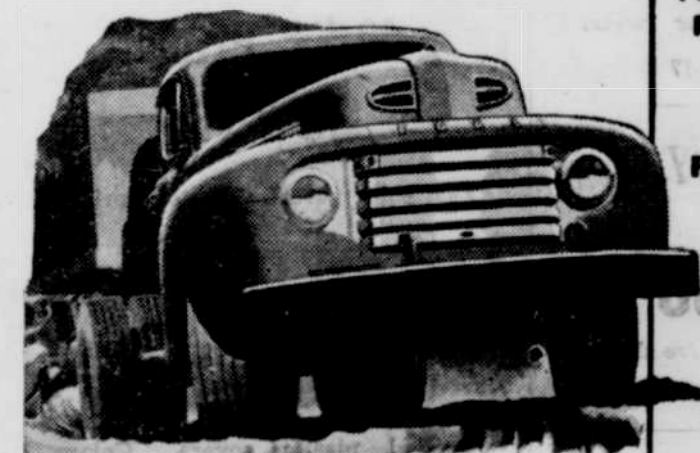

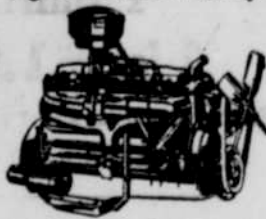
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
